
Soup with a Sense

12 years of Soup with a Sense attest to the success of this annual winter donation drive. Each year, over 200 socially conscious restaurant owners operating small eateries, traditional pubs and high-end restaurants all over Austria participate by dedicating a soup on their menu to their local food bank. Of each bowl served in Vienna, one Euro is donated to Wiener Tafel. However, the 2020/2021 season was different. Restaurants remained closed during lockdown which lasted through most of the winter. Few locations were able to offer "soup" to go. Old Bread with a New Sense

Bread and baked goods are the most important means of survival for many people. At the same time, baking goods are the food category of which the highest amount is wasted in Austria. Therefore, in 2020, commissioned by the city of Vienna, Wiener Tafel created a booklet titled "Old Bread with a New Sense", as well as a version written in simplified language. It provides useful guidelines on how to prolong the shelf life of baking goods, as well as various uses for old bread that cannot be eaten as is. Showcasing its many uses as an ingredient, our professional cook Petra Gruber collected old recipes and created new ones so anyone can make their leftover bread into a dish they will enjoy.



TafelBox: Don't throw it out. Take it with you.

TafelBox is the only food transport box with an added social value. At buffets or restaurants, customers are offered the choice to request this handy box made from biodegradable plastic and take home any prepared meals they would have otherwise left behind to be disposed of. For each TafelBox handed out, a donation of 20 cent is automatically made to Wiener Tafel. Jam with a Sense

Wiener Tafel volunteers, along with refugees, select edible fruit at Vienna's central market to be processed into jam under the guidance of a professional cook. Asylum seekers get an opportunity for inclusion and to take part in food rescue. In 2020, three tons of rescued raspberries were processed into 30,000 glasses of jam to be given away as ecologically and socially sustainable gifts for International Savings Day in association with Erste Bank. www.marmelademitsinn.at



Wiener Tafel Smell and Taste Lab with a Sense

A laboratory environment in which to see, smell, taste, and touch, the "Wiener Tafel Smell and Taste Lab with a Sense" provides an intuitive and fun approach to food for children. Through various activities they explore and experience the value of food as a resource and improve their competence in managing their nutrition. Experiencing the value of sensual perception and learning by doing are front and centre of this project.

Wiener Tafel Sensory Lab with a Sense

Vienna's Museum of Natural History is hosting the exhibition "Best Before – When Food Becomes Waste" until the 5th of September, 2021. Looking into the causes of food waste, visitors learn that an incomplete understanding of the best before date is among the main reasons why so much food gets thrown away particularly in private households. As an ambassador of food rescue, Wiener Tafel co-created parts of the exhibition in order to promote a responsible and appreciative way of handling food and to strengthen the senses of children and young adults through the lessons taught at the Wiener Tafel Sensory Lab with a Sense. After all, when it comes to food quality control there is no better testing device than your own sense of sight, touch, smell and taste!



Food Poverty: Great Significance, Little Awareness

Even before the Covid crisis, 6.6% of the Austrian population, that is around 483,000 people, were affected by food insecurity. Experts at the Vienna University of Economics and Business predict that the number of those affected by medium to strong degrees of food insecurity will double very soon. By September 2020, the Federation of European Food Banks, of which Wiener Tafel is a member, registered a 30% increase. The number of people depending on food donations rises continually because the family budget of many households is no longer sufficient. Shorter work hours and layoffs due to the Covid crisis have amplified this issue. More and more people who did not need to rely on social welfare before are now looking for support.

Opening of the Große TafelHaus

For over 20 years, Wiener Tafel has been a fixture on the map of Vienna's non-profit landscape. With the launch of the Große TafelHaus, both Wiener Tafel and the Verband der österreichischen Tafeln have found a new home. Furthermore, its storage capacities represent another important step toward rescuing even more food. The newly created Große TafelHaus at Vienna's wholesale market provides 800 m² of cool and dry storage as well as office space. The grand opening event took place on Friday, the 21st of August, 2020. Minister of Climate Action Leonore Gewessler, Mayor of Vienna Michael Ludwig and director of Vienna's Municipal Department MA-22 Environmental Protection Karin Büchl-Krammer-Stätter attended in person to express their compliments.




